There are approximately 4,000 fatalities in crashes involving trucks and buses in the United States each year.

Though estimates are wide-ranging, possibly 10 to 20 percent of these crashes might have involved fatigued drivers. FMCSA uses information that is collected on the frequency of approximately 900 different violations of safety regulations discovered during (mainly) roadside inspections to assess motor carriers' compliance with Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as well as to evaluate their compliance in comparison with their peers. Through use of this information, FMCSA's Safety Measurement System (SMS) identifies carriers to receive its available interventions in order

to reduce the risk of crashes across all carriers.
